The ninth Festival, co-programmed with SpringOut, is a wall to wall journey, a weekend of drama, humour, fascinating documentaries, great Q & A's and two short film screenings at which you can meet and talk with some of the film directors.

Two Girls Against The Rain (2012) Two women struggling hard for their love in Cambodia, a place of traditional customs and values. *Director: Sao Sopheak (Cambodia) 11 mins. Subtitled.*

Who's Afraid Of Vagina Wolf (2013) In this romantic comedy, charismatic film maker Anna is facing a crisis. She has neither job nor girlfriend and lives in her friend's garage in Los Angeles. Just when she's about to throw in the towel she meets Katia, who becomes her muse, inspiring her to remake Edward Albee's 'Who's Afraid of Virginia Wolf'- with a twist! Director: Anna Margarita Albelo (USA).

Bette Bourne - It Goes With The Shoes (2013) The story of gay rights icon, Bette Bourne, who took on the establishment with high heels and lipstick, playing a vital role in the fight for gay liberation in the 1970's and 80's. A real life Priscilla Queen of the Desert adventure of discovery and politics.

Directors: Jeremy Jeffs/Mark Ravenhill (UK).

No Secret Anymore (2002) The story of Del Martin and Phyllis Lyon, the founders of Daughters of Bilitis in the 1950's and central to the lesbian civil rights and early feminist movement. A delightful introduction to two legendary women.

Some Ground To Stand On (1998) The life of Blue Lunden, a working class lesbian activist reflecting on ageing, activism, a life spent doing what (she) wanted. A touching, inspiring look at a generation's search for identity. *Director: Joyce Warshow (USA)*.

Patrik Age 1.5 (2008) A funny, unpredictable, gay family comedy. After a seemingly endless wait, Goren and Sven have their adoption papers approved and Patrik, age 15, is on his way!

*Director: Ella Lemhagen (Sweden). Subtitled

The Children's Hour (aka The Loudest Whisper) (1961) Karen (Audrey Hepburn) and Martha (Shirley MacLaine), best friends, fresh out of college, establish a new private girls school. All goes well until the pupils overhear an argument referring to an 'unnatural relationship'.

Director: William Wyler (USA).

I Am A Woman Now (2011) Interviews with April Ashley and others, the first people to have sex change operations in the late 1950's. Did the choice they made change their lives as hoped and how did the world react back then?

Director: Michael Van Erp (Netherlands). Partly subtitled

Free Fall (2013) A story of forbidden love between two police cadets. During intense physical training, Mark is drawn to the handsome, charismatic Kay and realises desires he never knew he had.

Director: Stephan Lecant (Germany). Subtitled
